I. GSE Algebra I is the first course in a sequence of three required high school courses designed to ensure career and college readiness: Algebra I, Geometry, and Algebra II. The course represents a discrete study of algebra with correlated statistics applications. The mastery of Algebra I is essential for success in subsequent math classes. All three courses in the aforementioned three-course sequence are all comprised of content standards categorized as Number and Quantity, Algebra, Functions, Geometry, and Statistics and Probability. These conceptual categories portray a coherent view of high school mathematics content, but the goal in this class is to develop the foundational understanding of all five categories of content. In addition to content Standards for Mathematical Practice provide the foundation for instruction and assessment.

- V. Cheating: Cheating occurs any time a student solicits, receives, or offers unauthorized help on any assignment. This includes class work, homework, projects, special assignments, and tests. Whenever a student is guilty of cheating, the teacher shall collect the student's paper, mark a zero for the work and notify the parent(s) and the appropriate administrator. When writing reports, presentations, essays, projects, etc., students must give credit to all sources used, including the internet. If caught cheating, reassessment policy does not apply.
- VI. Reassessment Policy: Any student will be able to retake an assessment if they score less than an 80. Students must attend at least two tutoring sessions prior to reassessment.

Once they reassess, the highest grade they can receive is an 80.

- VII. Homework Policy: Homework in math is EXTREMELY IMPORTANT. If you don't do your homework then you will not know if you understand the material, and it is very possible that you will be lost when we move on to new material. You will have homework Monday Thursday nights. I do not grade homework, but I check that students understand the concepts. Grading homework takes the focus off learning and self-assessment/reflection and replaces it with a focus on grades and compliance. These do not cultivate a growth mindset. The more you practice the more you will know where you are struggling and the better you become.
- VIII. Late work Policy: Missed assignments due to an absence must be arranged for and made up within 3 days for students who have excused absences only. If your absence is unexcused or no excuse is submitted within 3 days, a grade of zero will be assigned for ALL missed work. I reserve the right to administer a different version of tests or make-up assignments for any student who misses an assignment.
